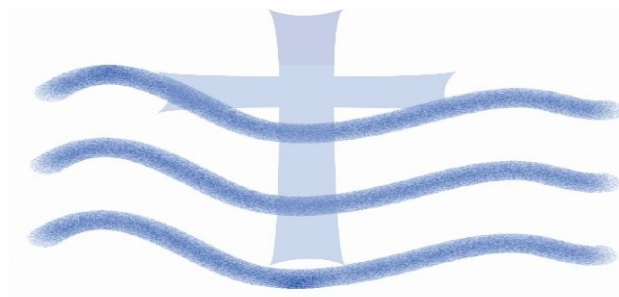

Pastoral Care Foundations Course

This course has been provided by Living Leadership and is self-guided. It is aimed at both those already involved in pastoral care and those starting out. It can be tailored to the needs of the group. It comprises six sessions which are designed to be both thoughtful and practical, giving both a clear theoretical understanding of pastoral care and the tools needed to do it well.

For each session we are provided with video teaching, power point slides and study guides. Each session will include video teaching with reflection, discussion and prayer.

The first meeting will take place on Wednesday, 30th September 2026 at 7pm in the Parish Centre, Scotby when there will be an introduction to the course and discussion on how much time those attending can commit to it and how frequently they are able to meet. To enable productive discussion it is proposed that there will be a maximum of twenty people attending and they will form groups of about six to enable them to get the most out of the course.
